- God's Word states that perilous times are coming in the last days. This is the key to what we should be fighting against. *Rom. 8:13 For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live.*
- The Bible lists the sins that will make our times perilous, so we should take heed and war against these sins, so they will not be named among true believers. *1John 3:8 He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil.*
- Though we may be guilty of these sins in our past and present, we must repent and turn from them in order to be healed. *2Chr. 7:14 If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.*





2Tim. 3:1 This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come.

2Tim. 3:2 For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy,

2Tim. 3:3 Without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good,

2Tim. 3:4 Traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God;

2Tim. 3:5 Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away.

2Tim. 3:6 For of this sort are they which creep into houses, and lead captive silly women laden with sins, led away with divers lusts,

2Tim. 3:7 Ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth.

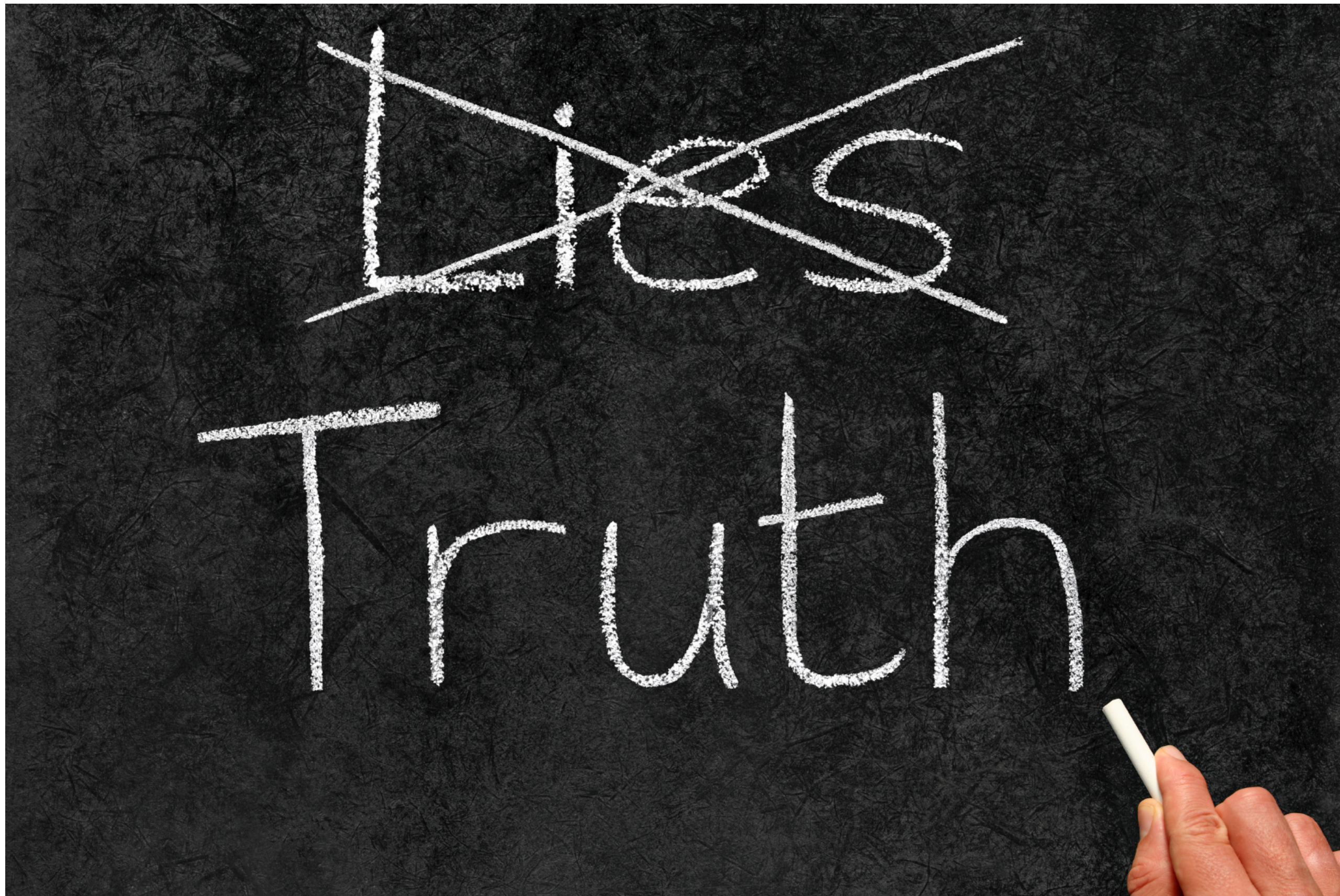
2Tim. 3:8 Now as Jannes and Jambres withstood Moses, so do these also resist the truth: men of corrupt minds, reprobate concerning the faith.



Sins to Overcome

- Lover of self - Giving expecting nothing in return
- Boasters - Rejoicing with others' accomplishments
- Proud - Meek
- Blasphemers - Reverence God and respect His leaders.
- Disobedient to parents - Honoring parents
- Unthankful - Being content and grateful.
- Unholy - Rejecting sinful things and fall in love with good things.
- Without natural affections - Operating the way we were created to.
- Trucebreakers - Keeping our brothers and sisters personal business private.
- False accusers - Without evidence we should not enjoy speculation.
- Despiser of those that are good - Celebrating those that God uses.
- Traitors - Being reliable and keeping your word.
- Heady - Receiving and correcting your issues when rebuked.
- High-minded - Thinking of others as more important than yourself.
- Lovers of pleasure more than God - Loving God by following His way and not your own.
- Having a form of godliness but denying the power - Allowing the indwelling of God's Spirit to manifest from the inside out versus an outward show.

Depending on what we have gone through, we may have issues that are listed in this passage. Most of these sins are sins of the heart and they are formed in our heart by being hurt in some way. We must address our hearts first in order to address these issues. The **ONLY** way to overcome hurt from our past is by purifying the heart through the washing of God's Word. This process can make us new and help us to treat others the way God intends. Accepting Christ into our hearts is only the beginning. His heart sanctification process matures us and fixes what our past has damaged.
