Lam. 3:26 It is good that a man should both hope and quietly wait for the salvation of the LORD.

Lam. 3:27 It is good for a man that he bear the yoke in his youth.

- Tried faith is really a tried wait! Waiting on God takes faith and perseverance through tough times. Psa. 27:14 Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD.
- Waiting is all about consistency and focus. In order to truly stay focused we must keep our eyes off the world and not be motivated by worldly enticement. 1John 2:15 Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.
- Being consistent and staying the course while we wait on God is impossible if we take our eyes off Him. If He is the source of our supply, then He must be pleased with us. Phil. 4:19 But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.





- Selfish ambition causes us to overextend ourselves, which will always change our faith. Instead of having faith for God to act, we start praying for God to work out the chaos we created. Luke 21:34 And take heed to yourselves, lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon you unawares.
- In this state, we are always trying to make things work out that should not be in our pathway. Surfeiting causes us to carry frustration and feelings of failure in our hearts which will always lead to sin. Prov. 16:25 There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death.
- When we lack patience and consistency, the devil gets a foothold in our lives and will war in our minds to make us jealous and envious of others. This condition can be called Cain syndrome, which is the downfall of many. Rom. 12:2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

- When we take our eyes off of Him, we lose our pace and move faster than God desires. This timing issue is at the core of every failed marriage, failed financial situation, and failed creation role. 1Tim. 6:10 For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.
- The world's pace is dictated by what we see and what others are doing. But God's pace is based upon the unseen future and only He knows what we will encounter later on. Gal. 6:9 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.
- Having the faith to wait for God is all about trusting Him with our future and remaining content with our present situation. Psa. 119:36 Incline my heart unto thy testimonies, and not to covetousness.
