




• In order to keep our faith intact, we must rid ourselves of faith inhibitors. 2Cor. 6:14 Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?

• Faith inhibitors are things that hinder our faith and cause us to doubt God. God tries our faith but never hinders it. His tests never contradict His precepts or principles. James 1:13 Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man:

• Faith inhibitors usually come in the form of people that should not have a presence in our lives. When we constantly allow unbelievers access to our minds and hearts, it will birth unbelief in us. Matt. 7:6 Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you.

• It's hard to maintain a strong level of faith around doubters. People that are not in sync with your beliefs will always create doubt. 1Cor. 15:33 Do not be deceived bad company ruins good morals.

• We are encouraged and recharged by the testimonies of faith that we see and hear from those that are around us. 1Th. 5:11 Wherefore comfort yourselves together, and edify one another, even as also ye do.



- The Bible gives examples of men of faith for a reason. This cloud of witnesses is necessary to encourage us and show us the impossible can be possible through God. Mark 9:23 Jesus said unto him, If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth.
- **Unbelievers can only promote themselves and their** own abilities. They flourish by luck and chance. There is no faith required when you live by chance. Rev. 3:17 Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked:
- This doubt and fear that unbelievers harbor will hinder our faith if we keep them close to us. This is why we must surround ourselves with true believers. 1Cor. 5:11 But now I have written unto you not to keep company, if any man that is called a brother be a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater, or a railer, or a drunkard, or an extortioner; with such an one no not to eat.
